



Thanks were given to all players for their commitment and effort over the season. As team selection centres around the ladder, time was spent discussing this topic. The following points were identified.

There will be a 6 week open challenge period commencing mid august to give ample time for challenges to be played and too accommodate holidays etc. New entrants to be put on ladder. Ladder movements to be identified at least every 2 weeks during open challenge season. A players meeting will be held 2 weeks prior to the leagues commencing when all ladder players and other interested ladies will be asked to identify their level of commitment to regular team or of their preference to be a pull in. High Adventure

Hill Walking in the Western Highlands The Loch Mullardoch Expedition. 2nd - 7th August 1997

Introduction

The vast tract of wild mountainous country running north from Kintail to Achnasheen in the Western Highlands is almost uninhabited. It is the abode of arctic hare, red deer, eagles and foxes. Although the great glens of Affric, Cannich & Strathfarrar penetrate the mountains from the east, no road bisects the region and the area is particularly remote. Twelve proud Munro's (Scottish Mountains over 3000 ft) surround the isolated Loch Mullardoch . Most of these hills can only be reached after hours of arduous walking.

About the Expedition.

ESC are organising an expedition to the area with an objective to climb Munro's. The team will be based in a private mountain hut 5 miles up the north shore of Loch Mullardoch. Although only accessible by boat and 15 miles from the nearest town this base is in the perfect position to enable the team to explore this magnificent country.

This will be a serious, well equipped expedition that will appeal to those who are in excellent physical condition with a positive attitude and a good sense of humour. No technical skills are required but you will have to be capable of walking and climbing for 6-8 hours per day

across steep and rough terrain sometimes enduring heavy rain and driving wind. The Mullardoch hills are exceptionally isolated and in the face of a severe blizzard survival rather than progress may be paramount.

Itinerary = Depart Saturday.
Day Walks - Sun, Mon, Tues,
Wed, Return Thursday.

Equipment.

All team members will be required to supply their own attire such as suitable mountain boots and windproof/waterproof shell clothing. Backpacks are available for hire.

Cost

The cost is £100 per person which includes round trip transport via mini bus. bunkhouse accommodation, breakfast and evening meal.

The Expedition Leader is Dave Thomas British Joint Services Mountain Leader (Summer/Winter). Dave has led many NATO Forces Expeditions on British Mountains.

For safety & logistical reasons the team will consist of 8 people and selection will be on first come first served basis & payment of a non refundable deposit (£25).

John's talent and attitude on and off court make him an ideal role model for any aspiring Junior member.



An Appreciation BILL NIMMO

A member since 1937 who died on the 19th April

Bill Nimmo who has died aged 79 was educated at Fettes College, Trinity College Cambridge and Edinburgh University. He qualified as a Solicitor in 1949 Joining the family firm of Russel & Aitken in Falkirk, the town of his birth. Later the company opened a branch in Edinburgh and Bill moved there.

Bill was a quiet and very modest man, kindly and courteous. As a family Solicitor he was diligent and conscientious almost to a fault. His elderly Lady clients would have been astonished to learn that this kindly, gentle man was an explosives expert during the last war, engaged in blowing up trains behind enemy lines. He was commissioned in the Argyll & Sutherland Highlanders. Subsequently he trained as a Commando and was posted to India. After the Japanese invasion of Burma he took part in the two Chindt Expeditions led by General Wingate. He next became a member of Force 136 which was the SEAC branch of SOE (Special Operations Executive) with them he took part in several operations where a small team of highly trained men parachuted behind Japanese lines with the objective of obstructing communications and obtaining information about troop movements etc. One such operation codenamed BISON was commanded by Major John Hedley DSO and his Second in Command was Bill Nimmo.

Major Hedley wrote a book Jungle Fighters which only came to my notice after Bill's Death. The following is an excerpt from the book.

I sent Bill Nimmo and Havildar Gum Naw off for 12 days. They put up a splendid show, covered an immense amount of ground and came back with all the information they had been sent for. I'm glad to say that for this role and his consistent work throughout operation BISON I was able to get Bill a well deserved Military Cross. I could never have got a better Second in Command and the Kachins would do anything for him.

The Kachins were a Burmese Tribe who fought with the British Forces. With typical diligence, Bill Nimmo took time to learn their language so gaining their respect and loyalty.

I did Law with Bill at Universirty but my main contact with him over the last Fifty years was playing Tennis at Edinburgh Sports Club. He had some health trouble in recent years but would never give up. He was still playing Doubles Squash two weeks before he died. After all these years I never knew he had a Military Cross up until a few days ago.

He is survived by his charming wife Anne, two sons and three grandchildren. I salute the passing of a very gallant Gentleman.
